## **ATTACHMENT A**

Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement (Federal) Contract No. 68409, Henderson County

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3. The estimated project cost is \$50,000,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed completion of the project that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public from lane shifts and traffic control devices remaining in place for a prolonged duration and jeopardize the necessary work that needs to be completed. The lapsing of trade contracts would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

- Item 4. The project has a completion date of November 21, 2014 with the addition of 30 working days available after the completion date. The additional working days are provided for the contractor to complete any remaining off roadway work.
- Item 6. The trades that will be used on this project include, but are not limited to: finishers, ironworkers, laborers, operating engineers, teamsters, and carpenters.

Item 8. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the construction of US Route 34 not being completed by the November 21, 2014. Existing US Route 34 currently passes in front of West Central School. The proposed US Route 34 roadway will divert traffic from existing US Route 34, thereby, eliminating a safety concern at the school. Disruption of the contractor's schedule from a work stoppage will prolong the use of existing US Route 34 at the school, thus, prolonging a safety concern for both motorists and school children.
