_\(\sigma_3\) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances. See Attachment A.
4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time.

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Attachment A

Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract 68C45, Peoria County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description: This project is approximately 6.4 miles in length along Interstate 74 from 0.8 miles east of Morton to the Woodford County line in Tazewell County. The roadway consists of 2-12' travel lanes in both the eastbound and westbound direction with 10' outside shoulders and 4' inside shoulders. Improvements consist of pavement patching, hot-mix asphalt (HMA) surface removal, hot-mix asphalt (HMA) overlay, drainage improvements, guardrail, and all other collateral work necessary to complete the project.

The estimated project cost is \$14 million.

Item 3: This section of the interstate carries up to 26,735 vehicles per day and is classified as a significant route. The project has the following working restrictions that make the sequencing and logistics of the project particularly challenging to manage:

- No work shall be performed on eastbound I-74 pavement from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on weekdays during Stage 2.
- No work shall be performed on westbound I-74 pavement from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. on weekdays during Stage 2.
- Once a lane is milled, it shall remain closed to traffic until all proposed hot-mix asphalt lifts have been placed on that lane and the adjacent shoulder.
- The length of lane closure is limited by Article 701.05 of the Standard Specifications.

Item 5: The project has a completion date of November 5, 2022.

Item 6: The time required to complete the project extends beyond the expiration of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the project. The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to those listed below. Trade contracts expiring prior to the anticipated construction completion date are indicated with bold font.

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Item 8: The project requires width restrictions during certain construction stages. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in an increase in duration of the project. This, in turn, could increase the length of time the traffic control on I-74 will be in place and the duration reduced lane widths. The district desires to minimize the length of time traffic control is required for this project and the length of time reduced lane widths are needed to reduce the potential for crashes and to improve safety.
