Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract 68E50, Knox County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description: This project is located on Illinois Route 180 from Illinois Route 167 to US Route 150 in Knox County. The improvement consists of furnishing all labor, materials, equipment, and other incidentals necessary for the completion of roadway pavement widening and resurfacing, temporary traffic signals, drainage improvements, cross culvert replacements, guardrail installation, retaining wall construction, sidewalk removals, sidewalk construction, driveway reconstruction, and related collateral work necessary to complete the project.

Item 3: The estimated project cost is \$25 million. The scope of work is challenging due to requiring staged construction on this 10.4-mile-long project with a narrow existing facility (one 9-foot lane for each direction with intermittent widening and narrow shoulders); in addition, some embankment slopes are steep and deep at existing crossroad culverts. Most construction work, including widening, drainage improvements, guard rail installation, driveway tie-ins, milling and HMA resurfacing, will be constructed under traffic.

No edge drop-offs will not be allowed at the end of each workday. Two-way traffic and access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction except:

- Two short time road closures with marked detours will be allowed while working under the railroad viaduct, and at the intersection of IL 180 and IL 167.
- Temporary portable traffic signals will be allowed at two locations to facilitate bidirectional traffic on one lane (for a triple box culvert replacement and for retaining wall construction).

Item 4: The contractor will be allowed 180 working days to complete the project. Therefore, the duration of construction activity on the Project will exceed one construction season.

Item 6: The time required to complete the project extends beyond the expiration of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the project. The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to those listed below. Trade contracts expiring prior to the anticipated construction completion date are indicated with bold font.

Item 8: The project requires width restrictions throughout the project length. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in an increase in duration of the project. This, in turn, could increase the length of time the traffic control on IL 180 will be in place and the duration of reduced lane widths, both of which increase safety concerns.
