Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract No. 60F05 in Cook County

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements

Item 2: This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3. The estimated construction cost is contract is \$16,400,000 00

This contract is one of three main contracts and a part of the \$95,000,000.00 US Route 45 from 131st Street to 179th Street reconstruction project. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would delay completion of the other two contracts, also scheduled for this letting, and may cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts that would occur during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and has made it necessary to have a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 4. The Department divided the project into three contracts to try to complete all the work for the US Route 45 from 131st Street to 179th Street reconstruction project in two (2) construction seasons using multiple stages of construction. The nature of the work for this contract involves widening and reconstruction pavement, traffic signal modernization/installation, roadway lighting installation, storm sewer installation, retaining wall construction, sidewalk/multi use path construction and landscaping along US Route 45, a local SRA route in the Village of Tinley Park. Orland Hills and Orland Park.

Item 5. This contract is scheduled to be constructed by using multiple stages to reduce impact to businesses and traffic delay.

Item 6: The targeted completion date of this contract is October 31, 2014 and this date falls beyond the union contract expiration date as shown below.

Item 8: US Route 45 has an ADT of 35,700 vehicles. There are no good alternate routes under the department's jurisdiction therefore traffic is likely to continue to use US Route 45 even when there are delays due to narrow lanes and shorter left turn lane at intersections during construction. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in additional hardship on the travelling public if the amount of time they have to deal with narrow lane and shorter left turn lane at intersection is increased.

Item 12 The Contract is planned to be completed in two construction seasons. The trades expected to be used on this project include but are not limited to laborers, carpenters, masons, operators and ironworkers. Any work stoppage due to expiration of contracts or strikes will jeopardize the construction resulting in inconvenience to the motoring public, safety concerns and increased delays.
