## Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64341, Rock Island County

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$2,800,000

This project involves the removal and replacement of the bridge carrying US 6 over Shaffer Creek along with the reconstruction of Niabi Zoo Road

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of lane closures. Lapsing trade contracts during the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 5: The reconstruction of Niabi Zoo Road must be completed within 60 consecutive calendar days. Niabi Zoo Road will be closed to traffic during this 60 day timeframe, requiring motorists to utilize a local detour route to access Niabi Zoo as well as residences along this route. The remainder of the project must be completed by October 25, 2013 with an additional 15 working days for landscape and punch list items.

Item 8. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time for closure of Niabi Zoo Road or lane closures across the bridge. US 6 will be kept open to two-lane traffic at all times, but a concrete barrier wall will be required to separate the work area from traffic. There will be added safety concerns for both workers and the motoring public, due to increased exposure, if labor force instability were to delay the project and increase its duration.
