#### Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64D23, Rock Island/ Henry Counties.

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$20,100,000.

This project involves the removal and replacement of the bridges carrying I-74/280 over Coal Creek along with resurfacing of I-74/80/280 from 0.4 mile east of Airport Road in Milan to 0.5 mile east of the I-74/I-80 interchange.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of lane closures Lapsing trade contracts during the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 4: The reconstruction of the Coal Creek structures must be completed between March 17, 2014 and November 7, 2014. Traffic will be limited to a single lane of travel in each direction during the construction of these bridges. The resurfacing portion of the project may commence upon contract award and must also be completed by November 7, 2014 with an additional 10 working days for landscape and punch list items.

Item 5: The completion date for the project is November 7, 2014 with an additional 10 days for landscape and punch list items.

Item 7: In the case of labor disputes, the completion date of the Project will be in jeopardy.

Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time for lane closures on the interstate. I-74/280 will be kept open to two-way traffic at all times, but a concrete barrier wall will be required at the Coal Creek structures to separate the work area from traffic. There will be added safety concerns for both workers and the motoring public, due to increased exposure, if labor force instability were to delay the project and increase its duration.
