Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 72E12, Christian & Sangamon Counties.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

The scope of the project varies from the typical resurfacing project. It includes resurfacing, median repair, turn lanes and bridge repair
