AIIACHMENIA:

The use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 60G37 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$29,210,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

Item 5. Contract completion date is August 29, 2014. The work shall be done in three stages. Stage One will consist of working in the Northbound lanes shifting all traffic onto the Southbound lanes. Two lanes in each direction shall be maintained during this stage. Stage Two will consist of working in the Southbound lanes shifting all traffic onto the newly constructed Northbound lanes. Two lanes in each direction shall be maintained during this stage. Stage Three will consist of median work and any other remaining work that needs to be completed. The final configuration will be three lanes in each direction.

Item 8. This project is located right next to the O'Hare airport. There is a lot of vehicular, truck and airport traffic along Mannheim Road. Should a strike of any kind occur which results in a work stoppage, it would cause further impacts to the traffic accessing the airport. Also, the motorists would be required to drive through the construction zone for a longer period of time than what is planned in the contract. While we use all the current standards and devices for our maintenance of traffic, the work zone can be a dangerous place for drivers. Therefore, use of a PLA will ensure we complete the job in a timely manner, the safest for all motorists who travel this route.
