In accordance with the Project Labor Agreement Act (30 ILCS 571), it is recommended that a project labor agreement (PLA) be utilized for the above-captioned Project. This recommendation is based on the considerations indicated below.

 $\underline{[X]}$ 1) The Project is being awarded and administered by IDOT (i e, not by another governmental agency).

 $\underline{(2)}$ 2) The Project is being constructed using state and federal funds. (See Attachment A)

 Δ 3) The overall size, scope, sequencing. logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances. (See Attachment A)

[X] 4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to be completed in one construction season (i.e., 80 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time (See Attachment A)

 Δ 5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption. (See Attachment A)

Item 2 This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$2,250,000.00

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 5: Contract completion date is September 30, 2013. This completion date is key to avoid any delays for the scheduled follow-on contract, which will include all remaining activities associated with construction of IL Rte 47 over Virgil Ditch #2

Item 8 This project is located in a rural section of the District The existing road network in the area is sparse There are no good close alternative routes for motorists in this area for use. Should a strike of any kind occur which resulted in a work stoppage, motorists would be required to drive through the construction zone for a longer period of time than what is planned in the contract. While we use all the current standards and devices for our maintenance of traffic, the work zone can be a dangerous place for drivers. Therefore, use of a PLA will ensure we complete the job in a timely manner, the safest for all motorists who travel this route.
