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## ATTACHMENT A:

The use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 60V41 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2. This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$6,100,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 5. Contract completion date is October 1, 2013. This completion date is key to avoid any delays for the scheduled follow-on contract, which will include all remaining activities associated with construction of the interchange ramps, reconstruction and widening of Stuenkel Road and associated intersections, construction of drainage improvements, detention areas, and compensatory storage areas, and ancillary work.

**Item 8** This project is located in a rural section of the District. The existing road network in the area is sparse There are no good close alternative routes for motorists in this area for use. Should a strike of any kind occur which resulted in a work stoppage, motorists would be required to drive through the construction zone for a longer period of time than what is planned in the contract. While we use all the current standards and devices for our maintenance of traffic, the work zone can be a dangerous place for drivers. Therefore, use of a PLA will ensure we complete the job in a timely manner, the safest for all motorists who travel this route.
