Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract #66420, Kendall County

**Item 1:** The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$24,000,000

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contract during any stage of the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 4: The duration of the project has been estimated at 250 working days and will require effectively all of three construction season with limited interruption to complete all work

Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in an increase in the duration of reduced width traffic lanes for IL 71. This additional work zone duration may contribute to an increase in crashes through the work zone due to the inherent risk associated with reduced clearances, speed differentials, and etc. that will be in place during stage construction.

Item 12: If the duration of the contract increases then additional user delay costs would be incurred from traffic operating at reduced speeds due to the work zone being in place for longer than anticipated. Additionally, construction of other highway improvements currently under development in the area could be delayed in consideration of potential traffic impacts.

The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to the following Laborers, Carpenters, Operators, Teamsters, Cement Masons, Electricians, and Ironworkers
