#### Attachment A

Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract 70663, Champaign County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

- Item 2: This project is federally funded.
- Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$7,040,000
- Item 5: November 27, 2014 plus 10 working days
- Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in an increase in duration of the project. This, in turn, would increase the length of time the traffic control on US 150 will be in place. The traffic control on US 150 consists of periodic lane closures in each direction controlled by flaggers and a closure for 14 calendar days occurring between June 1<sup>st</sup> and August 8<sup>th</sup> due to a profile change. While the closure remains in effect, the US 150 traffic will be added to the detour routes. The additional traffic on the detour route will result in additional conflicts. Additional conflicts typically will result in additional crashes. Also, 12 box culverts will be replaced under 24 hour operations with flagger control. A disruption during the construction of any of these box culverts could lead to unprotected open holes in the pavement as the worst case or temporary aggregate patches on a roadway with a posted speed of 55 mph. Either scenario would decrease the safety of the roadway.

The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to the following: Laborers, Iron Workers, Carpenters, Operators, Teamsters, and Cement Masons.
