Justification for the use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 66F09 within Kankakee County. The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all state and local statutory requirements.

The work involves the resurfacing of I-57 from 0.7 mile north of the Iroquois County line to 0.8 mile north of the Kankakee River Bridge in Kankakee. Also included in the project is milling the pavement, structure repairs, and roadside safety improvements.

Item 3:

The work to be completed includes structure repairs and mainline resurfacing. Coordination between the various work efforts to ensure work continuity will require a stable work force. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in delays which would extend the project past the desired completion date.

Item 4:

The programmed project cost is \$21,000,000. There is a completion date in the contract of July 1, 2022 to ensure no traffic restrictions exist for the holiday period. The use of a PLA is recommended in order to ensure the project is completed before the expected increase in holiday traffic. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in delays which would extend the project past the completion date.

Item 8:

The proposed work will include safety improvements in addition to the structure repairs and resurfacing. The presence of slowed or stopped traffic on the interstate is a safety concern due to the increased probability of a high severity crash. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in additional hardship to the traveling public because of additional time they will be exposed to construction roadway traffic control.
