REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF REGULATED SUBSTANCES

Description. This work shall consist of the removal and disposal of regulated substances according to Section 669 of the Standard Specifications as revised below.

Contract Specific Sites. The excavated soil and groundwater within the areas listed below shall be managed as either "uncontaminated soil", hazardous waste, special waste or non-special waste. For stationing, the lateral distance is measured from centerline and the farthest distance is the offset distance or construction limit, whichever is less.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Summerfield Drive, Roselle, Cook County

• All excavation planned at the northwest quadrant and northeast quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Summerfield Drive. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and William Way, Roselle, Cook County

• All excavation planned at the southwest quadrant and southeast quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and William Way. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Rosedale Avenue, Roselle, Cook County

• All excavation planned at the northwest quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Rosedale Avenue. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and 1st Street, Roselle, Cook County

• All excavation planned at the southeast quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and 1st Street. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Euclid Avenue, Roselle, Cook County

 All excavation planned at the southwest quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Euclid Avenue. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.

Intersection of US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Medinah Road, Roselle, Cook County

• All excavation planned at the northwest quadrant, southwest quadrant and southeast quadrant at the intersection US Route 20 (Lake Street) and Medinah Road. The Engineer has determined this material meets the criteria of and shall be managed in accordance with Article 669.09(a)(1). Potential contaminants of concern sampling parameters: VOCs, SVOCs and Metals.
