Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 62377 within Cook County.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: The estimate project cost is \$2,500,000.

A disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. This is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 8: A disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in additional hardship on the traveling public. 95th Street is a major east-west route through unincorporated Cook County and handles approximately 11,000 vehicles per day. The corridor already experiences severe congestion at the intersection of 95th Street and Flavin Road / 104th Street. One way detours are planned during the reconstruction of 95th Street and Flavin Road / 104th Street around the construction site. A disruption in the schedule due to labor issue will cause the traveling public to use the local street system, thus increasing he concern for safety through the surrounding area.

Item 12: The trades that are expected to be used on this project include but are not limited to be the following: Laborers, Carpenters, Operators, Teamsters, Cement Masons, Electricians and Ironworkers. Any work stoppage due to expiring union contracts will have major impacts to the construction schedule and the timely completion of the project.
