### Attachment A:

Justification for the use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 66A96 within Bureau County. The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all state and local statutory requirements.

The work involves the resurfacing of US 6 from IL 26 (S) in Princeton to IL 89 (N) in Spring Valley. Also included in the project is milling the pavement, culvert repairs, and roadside safety improvements.

The programmed project cost is \$6,000,000.

The estimated time to complete the work is 65 working days.

### Item 8:

The proposed work will include safety improvements to address outdated safety hardware. The presence of slowed or stopped traffic on the roadway is a safety concern due to the increased probability of a high severity crash. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in additional hardship to the traveling public because of additional time they will have to drive through a construction work zone.
