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### **Attachment A**

The use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62H60 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: This project includes State funding and the programmed cost for this project is estimated at \$1,150,000. The scope of work involves parking lot improvements to the IDOT St. Charles Maintenance Yard located at 38W027 Illinois Route 38 in St. Charles. The improvements include removal of the existing parking lot pavement, reconstruction of several drainage structure, placement of a granular material subbase, resurfacing of the parking lot with hot-mix asphalt binder course and hot-mix asphalt surface course, placement of thermoplastic pavement markings and all incidental and collateral work necessary to complete the improvement. Completion of the parking lot is critical to the overall operations of the maintenance yard and the area that it serves.

Items 6 & 7: There are several different unions that are expected to perform work on this project, some with multiple collective bargaining agreements. As shown in this document, there are many collective bargaining agreements that will expire during completion of the Project. With the high number of different unions expected to be utilized, there is an increased likelihood of jurisdictional disputes among unions or of conflict between unionized and non-unionized workers on the Project.

Item 9: The use of a PLA on this Project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency, and improved safety performance due because it will coordinate the labor forces of thirteen separate trade unions on the Project.
