The use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 60X60 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$2,030,000.00

In order to construct the project, a detour will be used; in addition, there is a locally let project that will use the same detour. Should a strike occur during the time the detour is in place and work had to be suspended, there would be an increase in the effects to the locals. Therefore any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 8: This project is located in a rural section of the District. The existing road network in the area is sparse. There are no good close alternative routes for motorists in this area for use. Should a strike of any kind occur which resulted in a work stoppage, motorists would be required to drive through the proposed detour for a longer period of time than what is planned in the contract While we use all the current standards and devices for our maintenance of traffic, the work zone can be a dangerous place for drivers. Therefore, use of a PLA will ensure we complete the job in a timely manner, the safest for all motorists who travel this route.

Item 12: - The project is planned to be constructed concurrently with a Will County project implementing the same detour route which does not allow for any delays by the work force involved in the project. The project includes construction of emergency access for use of the Fire Districts of the villages in the vicinity of the project. The trades expected to be used on this project include but are not limited to laborers, carpenters, masons, operators, electricians and ironworkers. Any work stoppage due to expiration of contracts or strikes will jeopardize the completion of the construction resulting in inconvenience to the motoring public, safety concerns and increased delays.
