Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64J68, Rock Island County

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2 This project is federally funded

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$7,297,000.00

This project involves the reconstruction of 3rd Avenue (River Drive) from 19th Street to 23rd Street in Moline.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that could cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of incomplete reconstructed pavement lanes. Lapsing trade contracts during the project could be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement of a PLA.

Item 5 This project will have a completion date of December 6, 2014. Fifteen additional working days will be allowed in 2015 for landscaping and punch list work.

Item 8: Any disruption to the Contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time for lane closures. The roadway will be closed during the reconstruction of the roadway and will require the detouring of existing traffic. This diversion of traffic, especially if left over the winter months, may contribute to additional exposure to crashes through the work zone and on the detour route.
