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Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 93617, Sangamon County.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements

- Item 1: This is a City of Springfield project, but State Let The city will provide Phase I, II, and III Engineering and handle the other aspects of the project. The city has requested this project include a PLA.
- Item 2: Just an FYI ICC Order T13-0098 will provide Grade Crossing Protection Funds (GCPF) for various stages of this project, including construction. District 6 is providing State funds to cover construction to be performed on 9th Street (Business 55). The remainder of the funds will be provided by the city as local funds. The city will seek reimbursement from the Federal Rail Administration (FRA) for part of the city's share. The city received a TIGER Grant from the FRA and is currently working on the grant agreement with FRA.
- **Item 3:** The estimate construction cost for this project is \$13,900,000

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to the labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public and movement of rail freight. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

- Item 4&5: The project is being completed over three construction seasons (240 working days), requiring an aggressive schedule to minimize safety concern and delays to the traveling public and movement of rail freight. Scheduling of the closure of adjacent grade crossings is to minimize impacts to the traveling public. Carpenter Street serves as one of the major thorough fares to the two area hospitals.
- Item 6: Below is a list of the major trade Unions anticipated to work on this project and their labor agreement expiration dates

Teamsters 916 – 04/30/14 Laborers 477 – 04/30/14 Iron Workers – 04/30/16 Operators 965 – 04/30/16 Carpenters 270 – 04/30/14

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Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may present great inconvenience to the traveling public and rail freight movement. This project is being constructed following a strict sequence of work over three construction seasons which in addition to the inconvenience to the traveling public and movement of rail freight, increases first responders response time, posing potential health and safety issues.
