Item #3 This project requires patching, milling and resurfacing on IL 3 at the intersections of IL 3 and IL 143, IL 3 and New Poag Road, IL 3 and Chain of Rocks Road and IL 3 and Pontoon Road Additionally, the southbound right lane of IL 3 will be patched, milled and resurfaced from New Poag Road to Industrial Drive IL 143 and Chain of Rocks Road will be patched, milled and resurfaced at their intersections with IL 3

IL 3 is a highly traveled roadway in the Metro St Louis area IL 3 has deteriorated at the locations described above to an extent that requires significant HMA overlay removal and replacement. This work will require complex traffic control to maintain traffic at the intersections during construction operations.
