The use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62M79 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: This project includes both State and Federal funding and the programmed cost for this project is estimated at \$24,400,000. The scope of work consists of the rehabilitation of the bascule spans of US 30 (Cass St) bridge over Des Plaines River including structural, mechanical, and electrical improvements. The open steel bridge deck on the movable span will be replaced with a partially filled lightweight concrete deck and the concrete decks of the approach spans will be replaced in-kind. Concrete substructures will be repaired. Approach roadway slabs will be replaced and portions of the approach roadway pavement will be reconstructed.

The project is located in the City of Joliet, Will County, Illinois.
