Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract 66K85 LaSalle County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description:

This is a bridge replacement project to replace a structure on US 34 near Earlville. There will be milling and resurfacing on US 34 as well as on OR 34. Shoulders will also be widened on OR 34 to allow it to be used as a detour route during construction of the structure.

Item 3&4:

Estimated project cost is \$7,800,000 with a duration of 120 working days. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in the delay of deadlines which would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. This project requires rehabilitation of OR 34 to serve as a detour and this work must also be coordinated with work proposed by the City of Earlville along OR 34. Lapsing trade contracts during the project duration would be addressed through use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

Item 6:

The contract calls for 120 working days which will require multiple construction seasons. The targeted completion timeframe of the contract falls beyond some of the union contract expiration dates:

<u> Item 8:</u>

Replacement of the bridge on US 34 will be done using a detour on OR 34 through the town of Earlville. Project delays due to labor disputes could prolong the time that traffic is rerouted through town, creating a safety concern.

Item 9:

The use of a PLA on this project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency and improved safety performance because it will assist in coordinating the labor forces of seven separate trade unions that may be involved in its construction efforts.
