 $\underline{[X]}$ 3) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances.

_____4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time.

 $\underline{[X]}$ 5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption.

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ATTACHMENT A:

This project is located on US 51 in DuQuoin from West Park Street to Stacy Street. The pavement on US 51 will be removed and replaced with Jointed Portland Cement Pavement, 9" placed over Stabilized Subbase, 4" and Subbase Granular Material, Type A, 12". The drainage system will be replaced along with the curb and gutter. The proposed drainage system will be oversized for detention within the pipes. All driveway entrances will be replaced.

Sections of the project will be closed in stages during construction. A signed detour will be provided.

Programmed amount is \$5,000,000

#3: This project is in the city limits of DuQuoin. The project includes several construction stages and road closures. Work related to this project will be accelerated to minimize conflicts to the travelling public.

#5 – For each construction stage in the project 30 calendar days of road closure are allowed.

#6 - Laborers 773 exp 3-31-25 Operators 520 exp 7-31-24 Cement Masons 143 exp 3-31-27 Teamsters exp 4-30-2025 Carpenters 4-30-28 Ironworkers 392 7-31-25

#8 – During construction road closures and detours will be required but should be minimized because the project is in a residential area and access for the property owners as well as emergency vehicles could be delayed. This situation can be mitigated by minimizing the time that these temporary conditions are in place.
