ATTACHMENT A:

The use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 60T40 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$6,000,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 5: Contract completion date is September 1, 2013. This completion date is key to avoid any delays for the scheduled follow-on contract, which will include all remaining activities associated with construction of the interchange ramps, reconstruction and widening of Stuenkel Road and associated intersections, construction of drainage improvements, detention areas, and compensatory storage areas, and ancillary work.

Item 8: Inside and outside shoulders along I-57 will be closed in order to maintain two lanes of through traffic in each direction. In addition, during construction of the bridge pier, the travel lanes will be narrowed to 11' in one direction. If there is any disruption to the contract, the lane width reductions and the shoulder closures would need to be in place longer than necessary. With high traffic volumes including a high truck percentage, it is important to minimize the amount of time for these closures and lane width reductions.
