- Item 2. This project will be constructed with Federal (80%) and State (20%) funds.
- Item 5. The project has 50 working days with an interim completion date of November 15, 2012.
- Item 6. The Teamster contract will expire August 30, 2012 during construction of this project. With a June letting work will not begin on this project prior to late July or early August. There is an estimated 50 working days available prior to November for June letting contracts. With a November 15 completion date any work stoppage could jeopardize completion during the 2012 construction season. This could result in traffic being maintained on the temporary runaround during the winter months. While that runaround is an adjacent closed and unused ramp it is not desirable.
