Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on FAI 270 (I-270) Contract Number 76J90, Madison County which involves replacement of the I-270 structure over the Mississippi River and all other roadway items associated to maintain two lanes of traffic at all times during construction.

Federal Project Number: NHPP-CRP1(426)

ITEM 3: Estimated project cost is \$327,000,000.00.

The proposed project consists of the replacement of S.N. 060-0035 which carries I-270 over the Mississippi River, with S.N. 060-0350 (EB) and S.N. 060-0351 (WB). New structures shall consist of new abutments, piers on drilled shafts with permanent casing and rock socket, 60", 70", and 80" web plate girders, 8.25" slab deck, and removal of the existing structure. Work will also include the construction of additional lanes along the roadway which will include earth excavation, continuously reinforced Portland cement concrete pavement 12", stabilized HMA subbase 4", type A 12", Portland cement concrete shoulders 12", subbase granular material, type A 12", concrete barrier, combination concrete curb and gutter, concrete median, limestone fill, steel plate beam guardrail, pipe underdrains, storm sewers, drainage structures, rumble strips, signing, pavement marking, raised pavement markers, delineators, erosion control and all other work necessary to complete the project.

ITEM 5: Construction is anticipated from Fall 2022 to Summer 2026. This roadway carries 25,000 – 40,100 vehicles per day. Peak hour restrictions will be enforced and only allow the contractor to close a lane during low volume times, except in emergencies. The condition of the existing structure is poor and may cause emergency shutdowns. As construction is drawn out, this will continue to be a distraction for drivers and continue to cause accidents in the work zone.
