The use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62M21 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: This formal contract project includes State funding and the programmed cost is estimated at \$2,600,000.00. The scope of work of this formal contract project involves the removal and replacement of damaged impact attenuators and sand modules on the District One arterial and expressway systems and includes the necessary traffic control to complete the project. The site of the spot repair work will be at various locations within the Counites of Cook, DuPage, Kane, Will, Lake and McHenry.

Item 5: The completion date for the formal contract is December 31, 2021; however, each work order issued has a specific completion date in order to complete the required task.

Items 6 & 7: There are several different unions that are expected to perform work on this project, some with multiple collective bargaining agreements. As shown in this document, there are many collective bargaining agreements that will expire during completion of the Project. With the high number of different unions expected to be utilized, there is an increased likelihood of jurisdictional disputes among unions or of conflict between unionized and non-unionized workers on the Project.
