Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64H11, Rock Island County.

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$5,000,000.

This project involves the construction of pavement widening and shoulder reconstruction on IL 92 from 0.4 mile north of Brights Court to 115th Street in Andalusia. Several culverts will be extended and new end sections will be constructed in association with this work.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of lane closures. In addition, an upcoming contract to replace the bridge carrying IL 92 over Big Branch Creek just south of the project limits could be delayed due to traffic control conflicts if this project were not to be completed within the projected timeframe. Lapsing trade contracts during the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 4: A total of 140 working days are allowed for completion of this contract. The completion of this contract is critical in order to achieve traffic control goals for the upcoming bridge reconstruction project over Big Branch Creek.

Item 7: In the case of labor disputes, the completion date of the Project will be in jeopardy.

Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in a delay of the project's completion and lengthen the time for lane closures throughout the project limits. IL 92 will be kept open to traffic through the use of staging, but the presence of traffic control devices and narrowed lanes will be necessary during the construction period. There will be added safety concerns for both workers and the motoring public due to increased exposure if labor force instability were to delay the project and increase its duration.
