Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 72789, Logan County.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

- Item 2: The project is both state and federally funded.
- **Item 3:** The estimate cost for this project is \$13,000,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to the labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause great inconvenience for the traveling public. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

- Item 4: The project is being completed under road closure, and requires aggressive construction to facilitate completion prior to the onset of winter.

  Construction of the project in one construction season is essential to allow the road to be opened prior to the onset of winter.
