Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract 66P43 Livingston County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description:

This is a milling and resurfacing project on IL 170 in Livingston County. Approximately 3.75" of Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) will be removed and replaced.

Item 3:

Estimated project cost is \$5,000,000 with a duration of 35 working days. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in the delay of deadlines which would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project duration would be addressed through use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement
