Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract 66K82 in Bureau and LaSalle Counties:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description:

This is a milling and resurfacing project. The work consists of milling and resurfacing approximately 6.25" of hot-mix asphalt pavement. The project also includes structure repairs, earthwork, lighting, safety and drainage improvements.

Item 3&4:

Estimated project cost is \$14,000,000 with a duration of 100 working days. The work is likely to be performed over the course of two construction seasons due to the anticipated award in the fall. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in the delay of deadlines which would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project duration would be addressed through use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

Item 6:

The contract calls for a duration of 100 working days. The targeted completion timeframe of the contract falls beyond some of the union contract expiration dates:

<u>Item 8:</u>

Work on or adjacent to the Interstate poses increased safety risks if suspended in an incomplete state due to labor disputes. This project will use drums to close lanes on the interstate during construction. Project delays due to labor disputes could prolong interstate lane restrictions and drop-off exposure, creating a safety concern.

Item 9:

The use of a PLA on this project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency and improved safety performance because it will assist in coordinating the labor forces of seven separate trade unions that may be involved in its construction efforts.
