This project requires patching, milling, resurfacing, ADA improvements and guardrail improvements on IL Route 159 from just north of Fountains Parkway in Fairview Heights to just north of Rosewood Village Drive in Swansea. The project corridor is one of the most congested sections of roadway in the Metro East.

 Construction of the project will require work during off-peak hours and the staging of construction operations to minimize access impacts to the highly commercialized area. The project length is 3.88 miles. The programmed cost for this project is \$3,600,000.
