Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on contract 64D18, Rock Island County.

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$2,465,000.00

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the first stage of the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 4: The project will be completed with road closure and the traffic on the state route will be deferred to the state and county system.

The existing IL 92 is a 2 lane highway. The scope of the project includes the replacement of the bridge over Big Branch Creek with road closure. The project completion date is August 15, 2014 plus an additional 15 working days for landscaping and clean up. The road closure can begin after March 24, 2014 to reduce impacts to school buses

Item 5: Completion Date is August 15, 2014 plus 15 working days for landscaping items in 2014.

Item 7: In the case of PLA disputes, the completion date of the Project will be in jeopardy.

Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and may result in the extension of the closure of the State Highway. Any delays will also increase the use of local roadway system and inconvenience to the businesses and residences along the State Highway. This additional diversion, especially if left over the winter months, many contribute to additional exposure to crashes through the work zone due to inherent risk of driver attention because of road closure.
