The use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62V17 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: This project includes both State and Federal funding and the programmed cost for this project is estimated at \$5,938,000. The scope of work consists of the replacement of surveillance stations, 16 ramp meter systems, the installation of one active wrong way detection system and the replacement of six (6) sign structures and associated foundations. Wireless in-pavement vehicle detection will replace inductive loops. Surveillance equipment will be installed in a new cabinet or incorporated into a modified existing ITS cabinet. Ramp meter systems include the controller, signal heads, warning signs and supporting infrastructure. The infrastructure installed under this contract will be connected to the fiber optic cable backbone installed under contract 62D79. The wrong way detection system will connect to the vendor via a cellular modem. Coordinate fiberoptic/network integration efforts of all installed equipment and route to TSC headquarters. The work also consists of excavation, site restoration, maintenance of traffic, and all incidental and collateral work necessary to complete the project as shown on the plans and as described herein.

The project is located in the City of Chicago, Villages of Lincolnwood, Skokie, Morton Grove, Wilmette, Northfield and Northbrook in Cook County, Illinois and the City of Highland Park in Lake County, Illinois.
