Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on FAP 312 (IL 3) Contract Number 76T69, Randolph County which involves 3-3/4" milling and resurfacing of IL 3 from IL 150 in Chester to the Jackson County Line. In addition, patching and minor drainage repairs within the project limits.

ITEM 3: Estimated project cost is \$10,000,000.

The proposed project consists of milling and resurfacing 3-3/4" hot-mix asphalt, guardrail removal & replacement and all incidental and collateral work necessary to complete the project as shown on the plans and as described herein. The contractor will be allowed to close 1 lane of traffic to perform work activities. As construction is drawn out, this will continue to be an impact to drivers and their daily commute.

ITEM 8: IDOT is allowing 60 Working Days for the contractor to complete this project. This roadway carries approximately 36% trucks hauling coal from the coal mine in Perry County to the river dock along this route. Labor continuity will minimize the amount of time the traveling public is inconvenienced by the periodic lane closures and ongoing construction work at the tie-in locations.

Any work stoppage during construction will extend the length of the construction project and the amount of time that the work zone is in place, thus reducing the overall safety of the roadway to the traveling public.
