#### ATTACHMENT A:

The use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract 60M57 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project includes State and Federal funds.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$23,550,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 5: Project completion date is October 31, 2014.

Item 6: At least fifteen (15) collective bargaining agreements are expected to expire prior to the completion date. (See item 12 for list of agreements.)

Item 8: Existing 147<sup>th</sup> Street and Dixie Hwy/Western Ave. has two lanes of through traffic in each direction. During construction, the travel lanes will be restricted to one in each direction and will be narrowed to 11' wide. If there is any disruption to the contract, the number of lanes and lane width reductions would need to be in place longer than necessary. With high traffic volumes including a high truck percentage, it is important to minimize the amount of time for these closures and lane width reductions.
