#### Attachment A

Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract **68884**, Peoria County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

#### **Project Description**

This project is located on I-474 over IL 116 (Plank Rd.) in Bellevue, Illinois. This project consists of bridge replacements (Exist. SN 072-0121, proposed SN 072-0252 and existing SN 072-0122, Prop. SN 072-0253), pavement buildup, minor drainage improvements, and other collateral work necessary to complete the work

**Item 3:** The estimated project cost is \$7.3 million. The challenging logistics for this project include detours, working restrictions and coordination with another nearby bridge replacement contract in Peoria County (Contract 68886).

#### Working restrictions include:

- Tree trimming along IL 116 for the purpose of improving sight distance for traffic control shall be completed before any traffic control implementation on IL 116.
- The Contractor will be allowed to detour IL 116 traffic for the following activities:
  - Removing existing beams (3-day maximum weekday closure, 1 time for Stage I, 1 time for Stage II)
  - Setting proposed beams (3-day maximum weekday closure, 1 time for Stage I, 1 time for Stage II)
  - o The proposed dates of closures shall not be adjacent to a holiday closure.
- Prior to detouring IL 116 traffic, the Contractor shall coordinate Traffic Control with Contract 68886, bridge replacement contract on the November 2022 Letting, to minimize inconvenience to the public.
- Flaggers shall be used during day-to-day activities that conflict with normal traffic flow on IL 116.
- When school is in session, no work shall be allowed after 10:00 pm except for beam removal and placement.
- All temporary concrete barrier shall be removed before winter shutdown.
- All proposed guardrail shall be installed before winter shutdown.
- Width restriction signing as described in the special provision included herein shall be installed at seven (7) locations adjacent to the project. The specific locations will be determined by the District Traffic Control Technician at the pre-job.

Items 4 and 5: The project has a completion date of November 15, 2023 plus 30 working days to complete punchlist and the following items: Final Hot-mix asphalt Surface, Final Pavement Markings, Cured-in Place Pipe Liners, 108" Culvert Headwall, Stone Riprap that is beyond IL 116 clear zone and final seeding. The completion date is based on an expedited work schedule.
