Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64B84, Rock Island County.

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$11,000,000.

This project involves the construction of a flyover bridge to carry 41st Drive Connector over IL 5 along with associated intersection improvements in the areas of 38th Street and Coaltown Road. This is the initial contract for the IL 5 reconstruction project from 38th Street to 70th Street in Moline. A subsequent contract for the remainder of the reconstruction work is scheduled for a FY 15 letting.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause disruptions in the schedule and construction of the upcoming contract to complete the reconstruction of IL 5 from 0.2 mile west of 38th Street to 0.3 mile east of 70th Street in Moline. Lapsing trade contracts during the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 5: A completion date of September 27, 2014 has been established to avoid construction conflicts with the subsequent project to reconstruct IL 5 from 0.2 mile west of 38th Street to 0.3 mile east of 70th Street. The completion of this contract is critical in order to achieve traffic control goals for the upcoming reconstruction project.

Item 7: In the case of labor disputes, the completion date of the Project will be in jeopardy.
