Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64D19, Winnebago County

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$27,000,000.00.

This project involves the removal and replacement of four structures carrying US Bypass 20: SN 101-0057 & 101-058 over the west channel of the Rock River 0.5 mile, and SN 101-0059 & 1010-0060 over the east channel of the Rock River 0.7 mile east of IL 2 in Rockford.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of lane closures. Lapsing trade contracts during the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 4: This project will take two construction seasons. All of Stage 1 work shall be completed on or prior to November 30, 2014. Winter Shut down is from November 30, 2014 to March 1, 2015.

Item 5: This project must be open to traffic (all lanes) on or prior to November 15, 2015.

Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time for lane closures across the bridges. The US Bypass 20 at this location is a four lane highway and is designated as a Freeway. The mainline will be kept open to at least one-lane traffic in each direction at all times, but lanes will be narrowed and a concrete barrier wall will be required to separate the work area from traffic. There will be added safety concerns for both workers and the motoring public, due to increased exposure, if labor force instability were to delay the project and increase its duration.
