Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract 64E08, JoDaviess County.

The use of PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded

Item 3: Estimated cost is \$3,100,000

It is anticipated that, if any labor conflicts arise during construction of this project, it will result in delays to motorists and also not completing the project on time. It is the belief of the Department of Transportation that the large skilled workforce needed to complete this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement of a PLA.

Item 4: This project will be completed by staging the work and constructing the bridge one half at a time, utilizing temporary traffic signals.

Existing IL 84 consists of a two lane highway. The existing bridge across the Apple River is 24' wide with 6' sidewalk on both sides of the bridge. The proposed structure consists of two lanes at 12' each, 5' and variable shoulder and 5' sidewalk on both sides of the structure. An existing lift station is going to be relocated on the east side of the structure. It is anticipated that the work on this project will be completed on or before November 21, 2014 with an additional 20 working days to do landscaping.

Item 5: The completion date for this project is on November 21, 2014 plus 20 additional working days for punch list and landscaping.

Item 7: In case of a PLA disputes, the completion date of this project will be jeopardized.

Item 8: In the case of any disruption to the Contractor's schedule of work due to labor issues, the project schedule will be negatively affected. The traffic on IL 84 will be reduced to one lane on the bridge during winter months. This will greatly impact safety and may increase traffic delays in that area. Also, the cost of the project may increase as a result of delaying the completion of the structure on time.
