Item 8 Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed completion of the project that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public.

This project consists of the removal and replacement of a bridge carrying IL 97 over the Spoon River south of Maquon. The bridge will be built under stage construction over two seasons, with temporary traffic signals in place with one lane of traffic alternating directions. If there is a stoppage in the middle of the contract it could lead to prolonged motorist delays and potential safety issues if the signal equipment and temporary barriers are not regularly monitored. This project also involves earthwork and the relocation of berms along ditches which protect adjacent farmlands from high river elevations. It is important that this work is done without any interruption in order to ensure the farmland remains protected during the entire operation.
