## Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 72C90, Sangamon County.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

- **Item 2:** The project is both *state* and *federally* funded.
- **Item 3:** The estimate cost for this project is \$13,200,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to the labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

- Item 4: The project requires approximately 95 working days, with an October 31, 2014 completion date. Construction of the project is not anticipated to take place over multiple construction seasons.
- Item 8: Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may present safety concerns to the motoring public. Traffic control left in place for an extended period of time, especially over the winter months, may contribute to additional exposure to crashes through the work zone, due to the inherent risk of driver inattention to lane changes, etc. that will be in place during stage construction.
- **Item 12:** The various trades that may be used on the project include Laborers, Operators and Teamsters.
