Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on FAI 255 (I-255), Contract Number 76E13, St. Clair County which involves the resurfacing of I-255 and minor bridge repairs.

The work on this project consists of patching and resurfacing of mainline lanes, C-D lanes, ramps, and shoulders, structure rehabilitation, concrete barrier wall replacement, lighting replacement, guardrail replacement, pipe underdrain replacement and other drainage repairs, sign truss repairs, pavement marking, raised reflective pavement markers, ADA ramp reconstruction at State Street and all other work necessary to complete the project.
