⊠ 3) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances. See Attachment A.
⊠ 4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time. See Attachment A.
⊠ 5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption. See Attachment A.

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Attachment A

Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract **68C00**, Tazewell County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description

This project is located on Illinois Routes 8 and 116 (Cedar Street Extension) from the east end of the Cedar Street Bridge over the Illinois River to just east of Center Street, including the Edmund Street interchange. Work on this project includes pavement patching, milling, resurfacing, and bridge rehabilitation. Work also includes earthwork, guardrail, and other related collateral work.

Item 3: The estimated project cost is \$15.6 million. The challenging logistics for this project include staged construction, working restriction, and interim completion dates:

- No traffic control shall be set up before April 1, 2024.
- No lane closures on Edmund Street are allowed when Richland Street is closed.
- The Contractor is only allowed 14 calendar days to close the Edmund Street ramps to complete the patching, milling, and resurfacing work.
- The Contractor is only allowed 28 calendar days to close Richland Street to complete the bridge painting work over Richland Street.
- The Contractor is only allowed 28 calendar days to close Center Street to complete the bridge painting work over Center Street.

Items 4 and 5: The Contractor shall complete all work, except as specified below, and open all the roadway to traffic on or before November 30, 2024. The Contractor will be allowed 50 working days, after the November 30, 2024 completion date, to complete punch list and the following items: pavement markings, raised reflective pavement markers, and cleaning and painting bridges. This completion date is based on an expedited work schedule. The specified construction completion date increases the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption.

Item 6: The time required to complete the project extends beyond the expiration of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the project. The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to those listed below. Trade contracts expiring prior to the anticipated construction completion date are indicated with bold font.
