## **Project Description:**

The work on this project consists of preserving the existing structure (SN 034-0062) on US 136 over the Mississippi River with a microsilica bridge deck overlay, expansion joint replacements, other bridge repairs, and all other miscellaneous work necessary to complete this section.

**Item 3:** The estimate cost for this project is \$10,000,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to the labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

**Item 6:** The time required to complete the Project is expected to extend beyond the union contract expiration dates as shown below:

Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may present safety concerns to the motoring public. Traffic control left in place for an extended period of time, especially over the winter months, may contribute to additional exposure to crashes through the work zone, due to the inherent risk of driver inattention to lane changes, etc. that will be in place during stage construction. The average daily traffic for this section of US 136 is 11,900 with truck traffic accounting for 9.0%.
