IDOT PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT DETERMINATION

In accordance with Executive Order 2003-13 (Blagojevich), it is recommended that a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) be utilized for the above-captioned Project. This recommendation is based on the considerations indicated below:

\boxtimes	1)	The Project is being awarded and administered by IDOT (i.e., not by another government agency).
	2)	The Project is being constructed using state or local funds only (i.e., no federal funds) (See Attachment A).
\boxtimes	3)	The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances (See Attachment A).
	4)	The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time.
×	5)	There is a firm construction completion date (November 18, 2013) established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption (See Attachment A).
\boxtimes	6)	The time required to complete the Project is expected to extend beyond the expiration date of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the Project, thereby increasing the likelihood of work stoppage(s) or other labor disruption(s) during construction of the Project.

Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64B80, Whiteside County

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$21,546,000

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the first stage of the Project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this Project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 5: This project has a start date of January 17, 2012, and a completion date of November 16, 2012. The contractor must initiate physical work within the project limits prior to March 19, 2012 in order to meet the requirements of the Nationwide 404 Permit established for this project.

Item 7: The completion date of the Project could be in jeopardy should union jurisdictional conflicts occur.

Item 8: This route has been identified on the Significant Route Location Maps, and based on the district's evaluation and experience with similar work in this area, the project is expected to exceed safety and mobility goals of less than 5 minutes delay and 1.5 mile queue. Numerous strategies have been applied to this project to relieve anticipated work zone congestion: alternate route marking; changeable message signs, \$1 million incentive/disincentive; night work; weekend work; a project website; and an incident contingency plan. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues will result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time of congestion on the local system.
