#### Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) on Contract #64J43, Henry County

The use of a PLA on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements

Item 2. This project is federally funded

Item 3 Estimated project cost is \$3,607,000

This project involves reconstruction of the intersection at US 6 and IL 84 West of Colona.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public because of lane closures. Lapsing trade contracts during the project would be addressed through the use of a PLA. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a PLA.

Item 5 This project must be completed within 90 consecutive calendar days between May 1, 2015 and October 1, 2015 with an additional 15 working days. This project must have all lanes open to traffic by October 1, 2015.

Item 8. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in the delay of the project completion date and lengthen the time for lane closures at the intersection. The mainline will be kept open to one-lane traffic in each direction at all times, but lanes will be narrowed and a concrete barner wall will be required to separate the work area from traffic. There will be added safety concerns for both workers and the motoring public, due to increased exposure, if labor force instability were to delay the project and increase its duration.
